

## **Andrea LAGHI - CV**

Andrea Laghi is an Italian radiologist currently serving as Full Professor of Radiology at Humanitas University in Milan, where he also directs the Residency Program in Radiology. He is the Director of the Department of Diagnostic Imaging at IRCCS Humanitas Research Hospital and a member of the Executive Committee of the Italian Society of Medical Radiology (SIRM). He graduated in Medicine and Surgery with honors from Sapienza University of Rome in 1992, where he also completed his residencies in Radiology (1996) and Nuclear Medicine (2007), both with honors. His postgraduate training includes internships and advanced courses in abdominal imaging and radiologic-pathologic correlation at institutions in Boston, Washington DC, and New York. In 2021, he completed a Master in Healthcare Management at Sapienza University. Dr. Laghi has held various clinical roles, progressing from assistant radiologist at Policlinico Umberto I in Rome to Chairman of Radiology at Sant'Andrea University Hospital and currently at Humanitas Research Hospital. His institutional responsibilities include key roles within the Italian Ministry of Health, the Superior Health Council, and numerous national and regional working groups focused on diagnostic imaging, technology renewal, and AI in healthcare.

Internationally, he has participated in the G7 Health meetings and represented Italy in EU cancer control efforts. He has served in leadership roles in major radiological societies such as ESR, ESGAR, ESOI, and RSNA, and contributed as visiting professor at institutions in Canada, China, Switzerland, and Uganda. He is a board member or editor for several leading radiology journals and has coordinated or contributed to multiple national and international research projects, especially in the fields of oncologic imaging, AI, and radiogenomics. These include EU programs like CHAIMELEON and EuCAIM, as well as AIRC-funded research on colorectal cancer imaging.
